

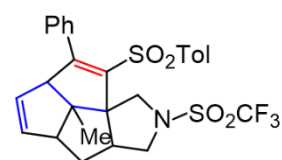
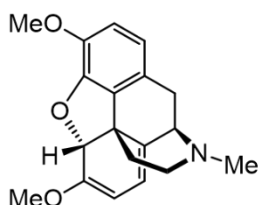
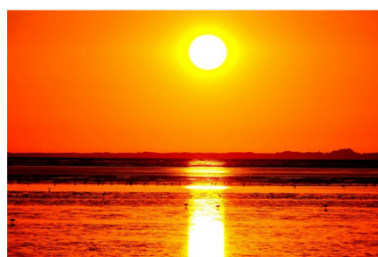
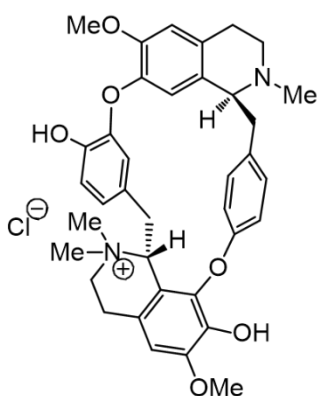
# Wood, Light and Electricity – Three Flavors of Synthetic Chemistry
